



Margaret "Marge" T Rosenbaum

June 17, 1922 - March 5, 2014

Margaret "Marge" Theola (Stole) Rosenbaum went to be with her Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, on March 5, 2014, at the Ash Grove Healthcare Facility.

Margaret was born to Lambert and Julia (Sydness) Stole on June 17, 1922, in their little house on the prairie on the parcel of land her father and mother were homesteading near Watford City, North Dakota. Her parents were both born in the country of Norway and came to this beautiful land of the free and the home of the brave when they were in their early twenties. They met (after coming to the states) in Joliet, Illinois which was where Margaret met the love of her life, Elda Rosenbaum, when they were also in their twenties. Elda was stationed in Joliet as a Coast Guard during World War II and Margaret had gone there to work.

By the time Margaret was 4 years old, her parents moved to Minneapolis, MN with their three children. She grew up there and attended Morris Park Grade School in South Minneapolis, Nokomis Junior High and Minneapolis Vocational High School where she took beauty culture.

Margaret's family were of the Lutheran faith and she was confirmed in the Lutheran Church when she was 12 years old. After moving to Stockton they began attending the Stockton Assembly of God Church where she had a born again experience with her Lord Jesus Christ and was later baptized in water. She was a charter member of the Stockton Assembly of God church and taught Sunday School and Missionettes for many years. She was a prayer warrior and spent many hours in her later years writing out her prayers, writing the scriptures and writing notes to encourage her family to always serve the Lord. She instilled in her children and grandchildren a strong faith in God and wanted nothing more than knowing that all of her family would be saved and be together in Heaven for Eternity. Marge now rests from her earthly labors and has received a crown of life that will never perish or fade in the presence of her Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

Margaret and Elda were married on November 11, 1943. Elda was discharged at the end

of World War II in November of 1945 and they moved to Stockton in December 1945. They bought the farm 5 miles south of Stockton in January 1946 and lived there until they both went to live at Ash Grove Healthcare Facility only two days apart, after Margaret was diagnosed with severe dementia and Elda suffered a stroke. They raised their daughters, Melodye and Corda, on the farm and lived there for 64 years.

She was survived by her two daughters and their husbands: Melodye and Ralph Snider of Willard, MO, and Corda and Randy Hayward of Stockton, MO; five grandchildren and their spouses: Brenda and Scott Lakin, Brad and Teresa Hayward, Christy and Gregg Bates, Julie and JR Woods, and Carson and Lindsey Hayward; five great-grandchildren: Paige, Britney, Jackson, Elias, and Caleb. Preceding her in death on September 9, 2010, was her husband, Elda Alden Rosenbaum, of nearly 68 years. Also, her parents, Lambert and Julia Stole; a brother and sister-in-law, Milton and Bernice (Bunny) Stole, and a sister and brother-in-law, Clifford and Sylvia (Stole) Williamson, all of Minnesota.

Marge's life was characterized by always putting others first and caring for others, especially her family. She lived a selfless life and was an inspiration to all who knew her. Her faith in God caused her to possess a peace that could only come from God. In the last few years of severe dementia she sometimes could not communicate clearly unless it was quoting God's Word or praying. She had hidden God's word in her heart and at this stage in her life it was miraculously observed. She was a loving wife, an excellent mother and the best grandmother, and a true friend. Everyone who knew her will always remember her beautiful smile, her gentle spirit and the twinkle in those pretty blue eyes. Though her smile is gone, and her hand we cannot touch, still we have many memories of the one we love so much. Her memory is our keepsake of which we will never part. God has her in His keeping and we will always have her in our hearts. She will be sorely missed by her two daughters and all of her family.
