Albert Irvin Meriwether, age 89, formerly of Pierce City and Eagle Rock, MO passed away on Monday, November 16, 2020 at his daughter's home in Georgetown, TX. Mr. Meriwether was born in Neodesha, KS on Sunday, June 14, 1931. He was the son of William Howard and Nellie (Burns) Meriwether. Mr. Meriwether married Mary Dean Pettit on Saturday, December 3, 1955 in Anderson, IN. She preceded him in death on January 28, 2007.
