Leon W. Aleshire, age 95, of Stotts City, MO died on Monday, November 20, 2017, at the Lawrence County Manor in Mt Vernon, MO where he had made his home for several years. Mr. Aleshire was born in Reams, OK on Thursday, June 08, 1922. He was the son of Jess and Ola (Martin) Aleshire.
