Patricia A. Pachlhofer, age 64, of Pierce City, MO died on Sunday, May 15, 2016, at her sister's home in Monett, MO. Miss Pachlhofer was born in Monett, MO on Wednesday, April 16, 1952. 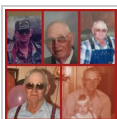
