



Reginald "Reggie" A. Murray

April 5, 1945 - March 13, 2022

Reginald "Reggie/Reg" Murray, 76, of Pierce City, Missouri, passed away on Sunday, March 13th, 2022 after a difficult battle with dementia.

Reggie was born on Thursday, April 5th, 1945 to June Fisher in Connersville, Indiana. He was later adopted by Wayne Murray following Wayne and June's marriage. He was the oldest of four brothers - Ted, Fred, and Don. After graduating from Wayne High School in 1963, he went on to study model making at Pennsylvania Military College.

After graduation, he landed his first job as a model maker and machinist for General Motors in Dayton, Ohio, where he worked until retirement.

Later in life, he met Bonnie (Sanders) Short, and they wed on August 10th, 1985 in Athens, Tennessee, sharing four children from previous marriages - Dawn Murray, Wayne Murray, Sami (Short) Linebarger, and Tami Short. Reggie also spent many years traveling the country, visiting 49 of the 50 states on his motorcycle.

In 2000, following retirement, Bonnie and Reggie moved to Pierce City, Missouri. Reggie's dream of retirement included wearing overalls and driving a school bus. Upon moving to Pierce City, he was hired as a bus driver for Pierce City Schools. He spent the next 17 years driving kids to school and

sporting events. In 2017, he retired to care for Bonnie during her battle with cancer.

Reggie was quick-witted and never without a funny story, joke, or limerick to share. He put family first and was full of smiles and love.

Reggie was preceded in death by his wife Bonnie, brother Ted, and parents Wayne and June. He is survived by his two brothers, Fred and Don, his four children, Sami, Tami, Dawn and Wayne, and three grandchildren, Ashley (Linebarger) Greenhaw, Austin Linebarger, and Jacob Burda.
