“ I am in my mid 70’s but I have known Verginia Hansen since I was 10 years old when our family moved in next door to her family. Later my sister married her brother making them sisters-in-law but she feels like a sister to me too.

I want to share something with you that I’m sure few people know because it’s something Verginia would never have talked about. Verginia was one of the most generous people I have ever known. She has for years had annuities going to several worthy charities. She has helped students with needed college funding. She has bought cars for some. Not a down payment, or a loan to be paid back, but wrote a check in full without fanfare or expectations. Not just used cars either, but new ones. She then helped with maintenance and insurance as needed. She has also bought brand new double mobile homes for some. Same deal, free & clear, no fanfare. I only know of these things from hearing of them from grateful recipients. Verginia never talked about what she did. I would like to share one example I know of firsthand as it involved me.

Years ago Verginia & her husband lived in Wichita Kansas and responsibly arranged for burial plots for the two of them. They were in an elite, exclusive cemetery & costed upwards of \$10,000. After moving to south Missouri she decided to choose Missouri as her final resting place so planned to sell the Wichita plots.

A few years ago my son died suddenly & unexpectedly. Being a senior, single mom with very limited funds I didn’t know what I was going to do to obtain a burial plot for him. I asked Verginia if she would consider selling them to me on an installment plan. She told me I could just have them. Imagine that! I couldn’t stop crying. I have never encountered anyone so generous or with such a big heart.

As it turned out my other children wanted their brother closer to home and were able to fund a local site so I did not use Verginias but I still can’t believe the generous offer. Still no fanfare or expectations.

She has been a good steward of the resources God has blessed her with. I believe that last Sunday when she came face to face with

her savior he said "Well done thou good and faithful servant. Great is your reward, enter in to your reward."

I loved her and I miss her.

I just heard about it from the grateful recipients of those favors. Now let me tell you about one of those instances I have a personal knowledge of because it involved me.

At one time Verginia lived in Wichita, Kansas & she & her husband chose a cemetery there for their final resting place. A very elite prestigious cemetery in which the plots were valued upwards to \$10,000. As she relocated to Missouri she decided to be buried there & decided to sell the plots. As I understand it was required to sell the 2 together.

A few years ago my son died suddenly & unexpectedly. Being a senior single mom on a fixed income, I was at a loss to know how I would afford a burial plot for him so I asked Verginia if she would consider selling them to me on an installment (lengthy) plan and she told me I could just have them. Imagine that! I could just not stop crying. Such generosity is unheard of! As it turned out his siblings wanted him close to home so managed to provide funds for a plot so I didn’t need Verginia’s after all, but still, the heart she had to offer in the first place touched me so deeply I will never forget! I could offer many other examples but you get the picture. She was a good steward of the assets God blessed her with and I believe
